With the 37th Odyssey of the Mind World Finals, Sally has coached 22 finalist teams. Even more amazing is that every year Sally coaches a team made up of high school seniors, the World Finals has been in Ames, Iowa. 2016 is no exception as this year Sally is coaching the Beechwood School team, with five seniors and one junior.

The 2016 World Finals team has been together for seven years and is competing in the Classics, Aesop Gone Viral. The team says Classics is

what they always compete in... it's their specialty. "The team members' problem is always different. Their solutions do not have happy endings," said Coach Andress. "They realize that happy ending don't always happen in real life, so they want to show alternate solutions."

Coach Andress says the team members are always giving extra time to practice, working hard, and recognizing that each team member takes pieces of the solution from each other. An indication of their successful team work was evident when the judge at state competition said he was so engrossed with their performance he forgot he was

judging.

They know there is no more school classes to go back to, they are together for the last time, and emotions are running high. But, the future looks bright. Coach Andress indicated that team members would be volunteering with younger Odyssey of the Mind teams, helping to coach and judge.
